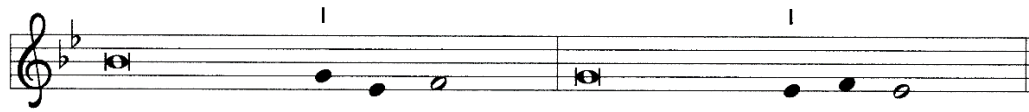





New Music Director!

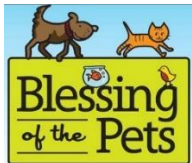

Pumpkin Palooza Coming Soon!

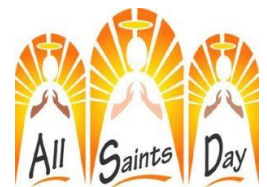
