



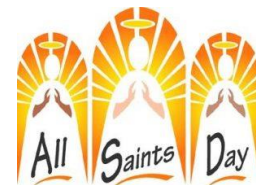
SHARE THE WARMTH Clothing Donations October 6 through 27
