WORD

FIRST READING: Genesis 1:1—15a, 19-26a, 27, 31-2:3



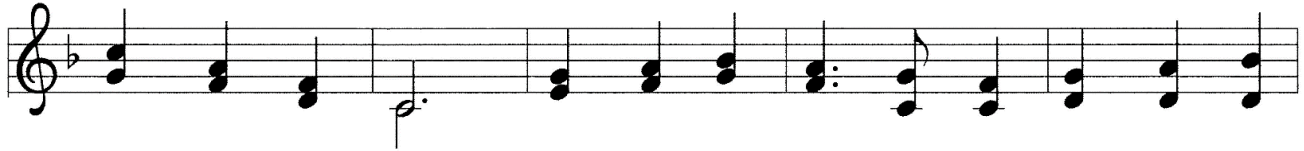

Reflection on this Week's Feast

On July 16, 1945, the first nuclear weapon was tested in the New Mexico desert. J. Robert Oppenheimer, director of the project, named the test **Trinity** (*Oppenheimer*, directed by Christopher Nolan, Syncopy 2023). Nolan's 2023 film asks pressing questions of humanity's responsibility toward creation and our capacity for great destruction. Theologians have questioned whether humanity's power to destroy creation might be enabled by our trust in God's omnipotence (Gordon Kaufman, *Theology for a Nuclear Age* (Nashville: Westminster John Knox Press, 1985). While the title of the test may not have had theological significance, Oppenheimer drew from the poetry of John Donne (Patty Templeton, "Plutonium and Poetry: Where Trinity and Oppenheimer's Reading Habits Met, *Los Alamos National Laboratory*), which envisions the paradox of being drawn into the Trinity and held by their love. Consider pondering the inevitability of the Trinity and humanity's role to accompany God in the mending of creation. – from *Sundays & Seasons*
