HOLY WEEK

Today begins the holiest week of the year for Christians. Take this opportunity be immersed in the story of Jesus' Passion, death and resurrection - the most influential events in human history.

+ On **Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday** evenings at **6:00PM** in the **chapel**, St. George's hosts services of evening prayer. St. Mark members are welcome to add this prayer time to your Holy Week observances.

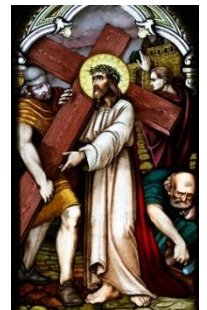
+ On **Maundy Thursday**, we will hear the **words of consecration for Holy Communion in Aramaic** - the language of Christ - and will have the ritual **washing of hands**. Bring your tired, dry, aching hands and experience the healing power of water poured and cross marked. Maundy Thursday worship is at **7:00PM**, and for the first time, it will be held **in the church**.

+ On **Good Friday**, we will meet at **12 noon** in the church **courtyard** and walk the **Way of the Cross** around the block in place of the day's usual Scripture readings. We will then process into the church for the remainder of the traditional Good Friday liturgy. If you don't drive at night or are looking for a more embodied Good Friday worship experience, please make our noon service a part of your Holy Week plans.

+ At **7:00PM**, St. Mark hosts the traditional joint **liturgy with adoration of the cross** in the **church**, with Father Mark preaching.

+ On **Holy Saturday**, we join with St. George's for a celebration of the Easter Vigil, with music provided by our SHINE musicians. The service begins at **7:00PM** in the courtyard with the Lighting of the New Fire.

+ Then join us at **9:00AM on Easter Sunday** for the **grandest celebration** of all!

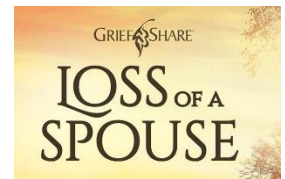


Easter Vigil on April 4 at 7pm

This year, the Vigil of Easter falls on the first Saturday of April, which is the same as our regular SHINE contemporary service.
